APPLICATION

The Department of Slavic Languages and Literatures and the Center for Russian, East European & Eurasian Studies offer up to \$2,000 for summer study of the Russian, Ukrainian, Albanian, Czech, Polish, Hungarian, Romanian, Serbo-Croatian, Kazakh, or Uzbek in the US, the Russian Federation, Ukraine, Albania, the Czech Republic, Poland, Hungary, the successor states of the former Yugoslavia, Romania, Kazakhstan, or Uzbekistan.

Grant Eligibility

- Students should be enrolled undergraduates at Stanford and plan to continue their studies in the following academic year (current freshmen, sophomores, and juniors are eligible). Students must plan to continue their study of Russian or other grant language upon their return to Stanford.

Submit *ELECTRONICALLY* the completed application, an unofficial copy of your Stanford undergraduate transcript (available on AXESS), and a one-page CV detailing your academic and other activities and interests:
